PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

At St. Mark, our classroom activities are structured in a way that strengthens our students' problem-solving, discussion, creative, public speaking, and research abilities, among many other important life skills. While these skills are part of numerous lessons throughout each student's day, I'd like to use this month's column to highlight a few specific examples of each.

Problem-Solving: Even as early as Preschool, students are taught how to work through problems. Something as simple as teaching different ways of putting on a jacket shows them that they can attack issues from different angles. S.T.E.M. projects at all grade levels challenge students to work in groups and give input on how to solve a problem in a way that works. Enrichment activities such as the Visioneering engineering challenge at SMU (which many of our middle school students participate in) allows students to flex their problem-solving skills.

Discussions: Class discussion time is key, and is incorporated at every grade level. In Preschool, students are taught that everyone has something great to say, and that we do not laugh at friends or classmates when they speak. At the elementary level, many topics are discussed as a class and students are asked for their input. Raising hands and taking turns are emphasized. Middle school participates in "Literature Circle" discussions and does an activity called "Grab Bag" which involves student groups choosing questions out of a bag that pertain to a story or novel. They are then challenged to discuss the topics and present their findings to the class. "Our Time" takes place each Friday before Mass. Students are asked to take part in a classroom discussion about how they live out our monthly virtues.

Creativity: From Art and Music classes, to classroom projects utilizing various presentation tools on the iPads, students are continually challenged to express their own creativity throughout their lessons. Illustrations must frequently accompany writing projects. Students create presentations using green screens and artistic backgrounds which are then shown on apps such as SeeSaw. Other apps like Thinglink also incorporate creativity. At the elementary and middle school levels, students are frequently given a choice of ways to execute a given project. After school Enrichment Clubs provide a wealth of creative outlets. 6th grade was recently challenged to create a mythical monster as part of a unit on Greece and Greek mythology.

Speaking: All students are encouraged to speak in front of the class. Individual and group presentations are frequent. Kindergarten students present a "Show and Tell" each week. All classes engage in a variety of presentations such as saint reports, the 3rd grade "Pushing Up the Sky" play, the annual 4th grade play, and presenting the readings at weekly All School Masses. Apps such as SeeSaw allow parents to see their children participating in classroom speaking roles. S.T.E.M. projects encourage speaking when students are asked to present findings during classroom and S.T.E.M. Day challenges.

Researching: All students are taught the art of research. Teachers and the school Librarian work with students on basic research skills including how to find information online and in books. Even our youngest students learn these skills. At times, middle school students will help Kindergarteners find basic information for their writing projects. Elementary students use various websites to find information for reports. Middle school enrichment packets challenge students to find answers to all sorts of questions.
